Brandenburg is a pioneer in the expansion of renewable energies. Progress in the system integration of renewables, the development of storage technologies, and nationwide grid expansion are central tasks for the coming years from the perspective of the Ministry for Economy, Labor, and Energy. At the same time, the retention of conventional energy sources is indispensable, according to the Ministry for Economy, Labor, and Energy, to ensure a secure and price-stable energy supply.

Until the second half of the 17th century, the area between Heinrich-Mann-Allee and Friedrich-Engels-Straße was still part of a large contiguous forest. The Tiergarten, established by the Great Elector Friedrich Wilhelm in 1665, extended to Caputh and Saarmund.

Under the Soldier King Friedrich Wilhelm I, the city of Potsdam developed into the "heart of the military monarchy." Around 1727, half of the area belonged to the Military Orphanage in Potsdam, which housed a girls' infirmary here. In 1769, a boys' infirmary and an official's residence were added. The current House 2 is the oldest surviving building on the property. It serves as the seat of the Minister for Economy.
